

Figure 1 | Public employment by subsectors: December 2022



On 31 December 2022, total general government employment amounted to 742,194 work posts, which represents a year-on-year increase of 1.2% (corresponding to a rise of 8,747 work posts).


The proportion of central government staff shows a high level of centralization of public administration.


Figure 2 | Total public employment as a share of the total population, working population, and employed population:

December 2022






Figure 4 | Public employment by subsectors and sex: December 2022



The share of women working at the local government level (45.0%) reflects the importance that support staff posts, filled mainly by men, represent at this government level, as well as male-dominated occupations such as firefighters and municipal police.

The high female representation in the kindergarten, basic, and secondary school teachers' career, doctors, and nurses, as well as in general regime careers (i.e., professionals, administrative and auxiliary staff) justifies the ranking.

Figure 6 | Public employment relationship in general and central government: December 2022





Figure 7 | General government careers with the highest number of employees: December 2022

Figure 8 | Public employment by age groups in general and central government: December 2022





Figure 9 | Public employees' average age by subsectors and average age of the working population: December 2022

Figure 10 | Public employment by subsectors and education level: December 2022




Figure 11 | Public employment by education level and sex: December 2022





Figure 12 General government compensation of employees as a percentage of GDP, Portugal and EU (Q4 2021 and 2022)




General government compensation in national accounts in Portugal, in the year ending quarter (4th) of 2022, represented 10.8% of GDP at current prices, 0.7 p.p. above the EU Member States average.

Figure 13 | Average monthly salary and earning in general and central government: October 2022




In October 2022, the average monthly basic salary for full time employees in general government stood at €1,569.8 and the average monthly earning is estimated at €1,846.7.

Figure 15 | Management positions in general government by sex: December 2022






Figure 16 | Managers' average age in general and central government: December 2022





Figure 17 | Managers' average monthly salary and earnings in general and central government: October 2022



Notes

General government: includes institutional units (entities) that correspond to non-market producers and whose production is intended for individual and collective consumption and that are financed by compulsory payments made by units belonging to other sectors, as well as all institutional units whose main function is the income and national wealth redistribution (European System of National and Regional Accounts 2010 - SEC 2010, §2.111 and following).

Social Security Funds: Includes all central and regional institutional units whose main activity consists of granting social benefits.

Basic monthly salary: gross amount (before compulsory statutory and optional pay deductions) in cash and/or in-kind paid on a regular basis and guaranteed to public employees in the reference period and corresponding to the normal working period.

Average monthly earnings: basic salary, bonuses, benefits or regular supplements, and compensation for supplementary work.

Estimated average age – Data collection is made in 5-year steps. The estimated average age results from the average point of the age band weighted by the number of public employees in each one of the groups.

*Figure 6 – Limited Executive Tenure relationship includes those within the scope of the General Labour Law in Public Functions and the Labour Code, Political Position, and Mandate.
